EMPIRICAL PROJECTS

Discerning attitudes and motivations toward biobanking in real-time (ongoing)

Multi-site survey project administering questionnaire to patients in real-time on general attitudes toward biobanking and motivations for accepting or declining offers to participate in biobanking. This project will be the first multi-site collection of data on this topic from patients and potential participants approached in real-time for biobank enrollment (rather than via the use of hypothetical scenarios) and will allow us to compare data between academic medical centers and private health care systems as well as between geographic locales. The results will be used to target practical guidance recommendations for IRB review and fine-tuning of biobank recruitment processes.

Managing competing trials (ongoing)

Qualitative interviews with health care institutional officials, departmental chiefs, and IRB chairs aimed at identifying the main ethical and practical challenges involved with managing competition between clinical trials and targeting recommendations for best practices.
