

STEVEN M. NIEMI, DVM, DACLAM

Steve Niemi is Director, Office of Animal Resources, Harvard University Faculty of Arts and Sciences. With over 35 years experience in biomedical research and commercial biotechnology, he has held senior management positions in contract drug and device development, biotech start-ups in human gene therapy and food animal genomics, and laboratory animal care and assurance.

Dr. Niemi is a Diplomate and past president of the American College of Laboratory Animal Medicine, as well as Chairman, Board of Directors, Massachusetts Society for Medical Research. He also holds a faculty appointment as Adjunct Professor, Department of Biomedical Sciences, Tufts Cummings School of Veterinary Medicine. Previous board service includes the Biotechnology Industry Organization's Food and Agriculture Governing Body, ILAR Council, Illinois Biotechnology Industry Organization, LAM Treatment Alliance, Massachusetts Biotechnology Council, National Association for Biomedical Research, Public Responsibility in Medicine & Research, and the Scientists Center for Animal Welfare, plus numerous national task forces addressing medical product development and lab animal welfare. Dr. Niemi earned an AB in biology from Harvard College, a DVM from Washington State University, and then received a US Public Health Service National Research Service Award while a Postdoctoral Fellow at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. He later completed the Program for Management Development at the Harvard Business School.
