

The future of abortion access in America is not secure, as recent developments have shown. The U.S. Supreme Court has two abortion cases on the docket, *United States v. Texas*, which relates to the recently enacted SB8, and *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*, a case that threatens to overturn the nearly fifty-year precedent of *Roe v. Wade*.

On November 10th, we will host noted historian of abortion Mary Ziegler, obstetrician/gynecologist and director of reproductive bioethics at Harvard Medical School's Center for Bioethics, Louise Perkins King, and faculty director of the Petrie-Flom Center for Health Law Policy, Biotechnology, and Bioethics at Harvard Law School, I. 
