

Amid a consequential year in U.S. health law and policy, the Petrie-Flom Center has continued its mission of providing interdisciplinary analysis and engaging the public on these matters.

After the Supreme Court's *Dobbs* ruling, Petrie-Flom Center faculty and affiliates provided analysis for media outlets ranging from the <u>New York Times</u>, to the <u>Washington Post</u>, to <u>PBS NewsHour</u>, to the <u>Boston Globe</u>, to <u>Bloomberg</u>. We also organized public events and analysis of <u>reproductive rights litigation in Latin America</u>, the <u>post-Roe legal landscape in the U.S.</u>, and the problems with the adoption rhetoric deployed in <u>Dobbs</u>.

Throughout the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, our blog, <u>Bill of Health</u>, has provided comprehensive coverage of public health and policy developments, and has hosted focused <u>digital symposia</u> on topics including <u>Health Law and Policy in an Era of Mass Suffering</u> and <u>Health, Disability, and the Future of Work</u>. In the past year, <u>Bill of Health</u> published over 240 posts and was cited in outlets ranging from the <u>Los Angeles Times</u> to the <u>New York Review of Books</u>.

Our research initiatives, <u>Diagnosing in the Home: The Ethical</u>, <u>Legal</u>, <u>and Regulatory Challenges and Opportunities of Digital Home Health</u> and the <u>Project on Psychedelics Law and Regulation (POPLAR)</u>, have continued to make significant scholarly contributions in publications ranging from <u>JAMA</u> to the <u>Harvard Law Review Forum</u>, and reach the public through <u>high-profile events</u> and <u>the media</u>.

In short, the past year has been productive for the Petrie-Flom Center.
