


Last spring, the Petrie-Flom Center launched a new research project, <u>Diagnosing in the Home: The Ethical, Legal, and Regulatory Challenges and Opportunities of Digital Home Health</u>. Since then, the project has been busy conducting research and sharing findings through various venues, such as high-impact journals and public events.

Already in the new year, we've published research in <u>Nature Medicine</u> on the novel liability issues associated with moving hospital-level care into the patient's home, and in <u>JAMA</u> on the blurry line dividing health-related digital products that are regulated by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration and those that are not.

We also recently hosted two public events. On January 19th, we convened a panel on <u>Challenges for Mobile Diagnostics: Mobile MRI as a Case Study</u>, which you can now watch on-demand <u>here</u>. This month, in collaboration with the Harvard Center for Bioethics, we hosted <u>Should Alexa Diagnose Alzheimer's? A Health Policy and Bioethics Consortium</u>. The provocative discussion explored the ethical and legal concerns associated with the proliferation of smart devices, which may be able to leverage monitoring data to diagnose diseases. 


