

This Monday, March 27th, we will host a panel on Psychedelics in the Global North, the first of a three-part spring series. This event assembles experts from several continents to explore pressing social and legal issues associated with the use of psychedelics in Europe, Australia, and North America. Speakers will address topics such as the historical and cultural contexts of psychedelic use, legal frameworks surrounding psychedelics, the role of psychedelics in medicine and public health, and potential risks and benefits of using psychedelics. Future events in April and May will discuss psychedelics in the Global South and the importance of psychedelics to Indigenous communities.

Also in April, we will co-host two events with the Massachusetts General Hospital Center for Law, Brain and Behavior (CLBB) as part of our Project on Law and Applied Neuroscience. On April 4, join us for a discussion of transfer laws that either allow or require children to be prosecuted in adult criminal court for certain offenses. Then, on April 20, Dr. Yasmin Hurd joins us for a conversation on the law and public policy questions raised by the legalization of cannabis.
