

While in some countries, governments have made concerted efforts to mitigate the displacement of sexual and reproductive health services by telehealth and other means, in many others the pandemic has provided cover for policies that neglect and even undermine reproductive health and rights.

Join us on Wednesday, July 29th for "COVID-19 and the Politics of Reproductive Health: Global Perspectives," a discussion of the impact that the pandemic has had on sexual and reproductive health and rights around the world. The event will be moderated by Alicia Ely Yamin, who, in addition to her role as Senior Fellow in Global Health and Rights at the PFC, is also a founding member of the now-formalized Global Health Law Consortium.


